
# OVERVIEW

## Fuel tank door release and cap



**NOTE:** Tighten until one click is heard. If the cap is not tightened enough, Check Engine "CHECK" indicator may illuminate.

## Keyless entry (if equipped)



**NOTE:** After unlocking, if a door is not opened within 30 seconds, all doors will relock for safety.



## Engine maintenance




- ① Windshield washer fluid tank


## Automatic Transmission (if equipped)



\* The engine switch must be ON, and the brake pedal depressed to shift from "Park."

Downshifting increases power going uphill, or provides engine braking downhill. For best fuel economy during normal driving conditions, always drive with the shift lever in the "D" position.


## Tilt steering wheel



Hold wheel, push lever down, set angle and return lever.

**Note:** Do not attempt to adjust while the vehicle is in motion.

## Windows-Power (if equipped)



### Window operation

**Automatic operation (driver side only)** Push the switch completely down and release to fully open. To stop window midway, lightly pull the switch up.


**Window lock switch** Deactivates all passenger windows. Driver's window remains operable.




- 1 Position


### To fold down the rear seatback

- (1) Slide the seatback security lock to the right unlock position from the trunk room.
- (2) Lower the seat headrests.
- (3) Pull the lock release knob up.
- (4) Fold the seatback down.





Front fog lights turn on only when the headlights are on low beam.





## CD PLAYER


**To scan tracks on a disc** Push and hold "SCAN." Push again to hold selection.

## RADIO

**To preset stations** Tune in the desired station and hold down a preset button (1-6) until you hear a beep. Push desired preset button (1-6) to select.


**To scan stations** Push "SCAN." Push and hold to scan preset stations. Push again to hold selection.

By inserting a mini plug of a commercially available component into the AUX audio jack, you can listen to music from a portable audio device through the vehicle's speaker system.








# SAFETY AND EMERGENCY FEATURES

## Door locks-Power (if equipped)




## Doors-Child safety locks



Moving the lever to "LOCK" will allow the door to be opened only from the outside.

## Seat belts



If belt is fully extended, then retracted even slightly, it cannot be re-extended beyond that point, unless fully retracted again. This feature is used to help hold child restraint systems securely.



## Tire Pressure Warning System

If tire pressure becomes critically low on any of the tires (excluding the spare), indicator will illuminate. Correctly adjusting tire inflation will turn off the light after a few minutes. If the light does not turn off, have the system checked by your Toyota dealer.






### Removing the spare tire
